

# Chambers USA Ranks BLB&G as Top Securities Litigation and Delaware Chancery Firm in 2026 Guide

BLB&G has again been ranked a top firm in the nation for plaintiff-side securities litigation and chancery work in the *Chambers USA 2026* guide.

The firm earned “Band 1” rankings for securities litigation in the Nationwide, New York, and California categories, as well as “Band 2” for plaintiff-side chancery work in Delaware. BLB&G has received top rankings for securities litigation every year since *Chambers* created the category to recognize a select number of firms performing plaintiff-side work.

The *Chambers* guide features commendations from BLB&G clients, who praise the attorneys’ deep trial experience and industry expertise. Sources highlight the firm’s ability to “handle large-scale and complex discovery better than almost anyone else in the plaintiffs’ Bar” and recognize BLB&G as “a leader in the field of securities litigation.”

Individually, *Chambers* honored Partners Max Berger, Salvatore Graziano, Jim Harrod, John Rizio-Hamilton, Hannah Ross, Jerry Silk, Katie Sinderson, Jon Uslaner, and Greg Varallo among an elite group of practitioners in the field.

**Max Berger**, ranked Band 1 in New York for Litigation: Securities: Plaintiffs, is noted by *Chambers* as having “secured some of the largest recoveries ever achieved in securities fraud lawsuits.” The publication notes that Max “offers notable strength in high-stakes class action and derivative lawsuits.” As one quoted source praised, “There is no one more trustworthy or skilled than Max.”

**Salvatore Graziano**, ranked Band 1 in New York for Litigation: Securities: Plaintiffs, is described by quoted sources as “a very experienced and talented lawyer” who “provides seasoned judgment.” *Chambers* notes that he “possesses expertise in cases across diverse industries, from defense to pharmaceuticals.”

**Jim Harrod**, ranked Band 3 in New York for Litigation: Securities: Plaintiffs, is noted by *Chambers* as having “extensive expertise representing plaintiffs in large domestic and cross-border securities disputes.” He is described by quoted sources as someone who “provides a high level of attention to detail and is a very capable attorney.”

**John Rizio-Hamilton**, elevated to Band 2 in New York for Litigation: Securities: Plaintiffs, is described by *Chambers* as “an experienced litigator who is often sought after to represent investor plaintiffs in large cases against companies in industries such as tech, logistics and finance.” Sources praise John as a “smart and experienced lawyer.”

**Hannah Ross**, ranked Band 2 in New York for Litigation: Securities: Plaintiffs, is recognized as “an experienced litigator with a considerable trial background.” Sources note her unwavering dedication to her clients, saying, “Hannah is extremely dedicated and hardworking. She makes sure that client follow-up is best in class.”

**Jerry Silk**, ranked Band 1 in New York for Litigation: Securities: Plaintiffs, is “recognized for his expertise in a range of cases on the plaintiff side...highly experienced in cases involving alleged false and misleading statements, as well as M&A litigation and accountants’ liability cases.”

**Katie Sinderson**, elevated to Band 2 in New York for Litigation: Securities: Plaintiffs, is recognized by *Chambers* as “an experienced securities litigator with a strong track record assisting investors with securities fraud class actions.” Katie is described by quoted sources as “superb in every way,” and “a worthy adversary and a strong, sophisticated lawyer.”

**Jonathan Uslaner**, elevated to Band 2 in California for Litigation: Securities: Mainly Plaintiffs, is described by *Chambers* as an “expert plaintiff securities litigator with a wealth of experience in leading direct and class actions.” He is described by quoted sources as “a skilled and savvy lawyer” and “a formidable opponent who zealously advocates for his investor clients.”

**Greg Varallo**, ranked Band 1 in Delaware for Chancery: Mainly Plaintiffs, is noted by *Chambers* as “a respected litigator active on behalf of plaintiff clients in a range of corporate disputes” who “acts across matters including derivative actions and fiduciary duty concerns.” He is described by quoted sources as “quick on his feet...constantly finding and exploiting the holes in his opponent’s case.”
