Max Berger Receives Honorary Degree At Baruch College 2019 Commencement

"Berger, who received his Juris Doctorate degree from Columbia University Law School, established the Max Berger Pre-Law Program at Baruch College, which assists high-potential Baruch College students to gain admission to the nation's top law schools."
